## WHO WILL BENEFIT FROM ATTENDING

The target audience for the Alopecia Areata Summit includes dermatologists who practice in a clinical setting treating patients who suffer from hair loss disorders, including alopecia areata.

Other attendees will include pediatricians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, nurses, and other clinical providers who have the potential to affect the outcomes of patients with alopecia areata.

Additionally, the audience will include a wide range of research scientists with an interest in hair, hair loss, and hair loss disorders.

## **LEARNING OBJECTIVES**

As a result of participating in this activity, attendees should be able to:

- Explain the JAK signaling pathway and the mechanism of action of JAK inhibitors on alopecia areata, including the immune response and effects on T cell populations.
- Understand the landscape of JAK inhibitors, specifically, differentiate between JAK 1, 2, 3 and Tyk2, and list the FDA-approved JAK inhibitors, including their type(s) with their indications.
- Discuss current clinical trials with JAK inhibitors for the treatment of alopecia areata.
- Discuss the current research in genetics including results of genome-wide association studies (GWAS), and associations with related autoimmune diseases.
- Evaluate the classical treatments of alopecia areata, as well as JAK inhibitors, including an understanding of efficacy, safety, side-effects and risk/benefit of each modality.
- Review the treatment of alopecia areata in specific body sites, such as eyebrows and eyelashes, beard, and nails.
- Design a personalized first and second line treatment plan for alopecia areata patients.
- Improve patient communication in talking about new therapies, including speaking with parents of children with alopecia areata.

# **About AHRS**

The AHRS began as, "The North American Hair Research Society (NAHRS)" in 1989 by a group of dermatologists committed to furthering research in hair-related disorders. They had identified a need for an organization that supported hair research and were determined to fulfill it. The benefits of the interactions among clinicians, pathologists, clinical investigators, and basic scientists were of paramount importance.

Over the past decades, the connection between clinical and basic researchers interested in hair biology has nurtured the organization. In 2016, there became an apparent increased interest by Central and South American colleagues, and a "Pan Am Work Group" was established. In 2017, the NAHRS, which was previously focused in the U.S. and Canada, formally expanded to, "American Hair Research Society (AHRS)" – the hair research society representing all of the Americas. In 2018, AHRS added to its meeting calendar sessions at CILAD, RADLA, and other prestigious meetings in Latin America.
